Strong, determined and independent, at age 80 she dug a pond in her backyard before her son could arrive to do the job. She



was lovingly known as the "Kitchen Witch" by her church congregation,

because until she was age 90 she would show up every week to clean the kitchen from top to bottom.

Her sense of independence began at 19 when she boarded a train, alone, from her home in St. Louis and headed for California to marry her husband, whom she had met in school. He was an active Marine and was in San Diego on a short leave.

Joyce was always up to something—playing golf, gardening, making crafts and taking care of her Dachshunds. She loved this breed so much that she had them her whole life. With two children, she found time to be a Boy Scout leader and keep them occupied in the family's above-ground swimming pool, boys in for 30 minutes, then girls in for 30 minutes.
